The South Kingstown Police Department respectfully submits its Annual Report of activities and public safety services provided during the 2014 calendar year. The statistical data contained herein is useful in the identification of crime trends and traffic safety concerns and quality of life issues that enable the department to institute proactive prevention strategies. Incorporated within this report are brief narratives that highlight the projects, functions, and accomplishments of the various Divisions within the department. I believe these narratives represent the dedication of our officers in delivering police services in a manner prescribed by law and insures the rights of all citizens.

As noted in the report, the department is currently pursuing accreditation status through the Rhode Island Police Accreditation Commission. A major effort is underway to complete this process over the next year which involves a comprehensive review of all policies and procedures to adhere to best practices and the highest level of police professionalism.

The report also identifies the extent of the in-service training provided to the men and women of the department. This training encompasses every level of professional law enforcement designed to provide our officers with the technology and tools to perform at the highest level of professionalism. A major accomplishment in 2014 was the implementation of a new program for the deployment of the TASER conducted electrical weapon (CEW). This is an effective tool in subduing uncooperative and/or dangerous subjects without the use of deadly force.

Our Mission Philosophy advocates that in addition to our principal responsibility to maintain public peace our officers also function as public service providers. In furtherance of this effort, several department members sit on or are advisors to advocacy groups dedicated to South Kingstown quality of life issues.

The department has always recognized that our continued effectiveness is contingent upon the community support we now enjoy. I believe the content of this report affirms the dedication of the men and women of this police department, both sworn and civilian. I wish to acknowledge the ever present support of our citizenry, the Town Council, and the Town Administration who make it possible for the department to deliver effective and professional police service. Our resolve is to continue the reputation that South Kingstown proudly holds as a safe community for all citizens.



MISSION STATEMENT

The Mission Philosophy of the South Kingstown Police Department is a component of the Department Rules and Regulations, which in accordance with Town Charter, were adopted and approved by the Town Council in August 1987. This mission statement is unique in that in addition to defining the well-accepted principal duties of law enforcement, it also advocates that the Town's public safety personnel recognize the need to function as community service providers.

MISSION PHILOSOPHY

The primary responsibility and mission of the South Kingstown Police Department is to provide total community service. Although preservation of peace and protection of lives and property are the principle duties of a police officer, South Kingstown Public Safety Personnel, both sworn and civilian, also function as public service officers responsible for identifying and responding to service needs of all our citizens. South Kingstown Police Officers recognize their roles in this multi-service organization by providing assistance and counseling for a wide range of services from simple street directions to referrals of services of other agencies not provided by police.

The spirit of South Kingstown Police Officers is to identify, report, and remove a variety of public safety hazards and to provide assistance to insure citizen safety at every opportunity. In addition South Kingstown Officers are also public safety officers responsible for ensuring safe, orderly and lawful conduct in the community through various crime fighting activities designed to discourage illegal behavior and to elicit community cooperation.

It is the mission of the South Kingstown Police Department to deliver the highest level of police professionalism to the Citizens of South Kingstown in a sensitive and efficient manner within the rule of law which guarantees individual rights to all our citizens. Officers of the South Kingstown Police Department will conduct their professional responsibilities in a disciplined manner pledging to uphold the laws of the Nation, State, Town Code and Rules and Regulations of the South Kingstown Police Department.

SOUTH KINGSTOWN POLICE DEPARTMENT - GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

- a) To create and maintain a feeling of security in the community.
- b) To resolve conflict between individuals and groups while preserving constitutional guarantees of all citizens.
- c) To safely facilitate the movement of people and vehicles.
- d) To aid and direct persons who are in danger of physical harm.
- e) To prevent and control unlawful acts and to arrest perpetrators of unlawful acts based upon sound legal principals of reasonable grounds.
- f) To assist those who cannot care for themselves: such as the intoxicated, the addicted, the mentally ill, physically disabled, the old, and the young.
- g) Improve communications and relations with the public.
- h) Enhance police officers' understanding of their role and of the culture of their community.
- i) Maintain professional standards for the conduct of their duties, and provide for ongoing training programs.



DIVISION REPORTS 2014

DETECTIVE DIVISION

The Detective Division experienced growth in technology and within the ranks during 2014. Sergeant Alfred Bucco was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant and remained assigned to the Detective Division to serve as the Detective Commander. The department acquired a state of the art audio and video recording system to aid in the memorialization of interviews and interrogations. Detective Joseph Iannelli remained assigned to the Drug Enforcement Agency Task Force as a Task Force Officer and successfully investigated several high profile narcotic cases that led to the successful prosecution of drug offenders in the Federal Court System.

STATISTICAL REVIEW AND ANALYSIS

The Uniform Crime Report (UCR) submitted each year by the police department contains statistical information covering the seven major crime classifications of homicide, rape, robbery, assault, burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft. UCR figures for the year 2014 show the number of known offenses reported to the police department to be four hundred and thirty nine (439). When compared to the report of the previous year the record reflects a slight decrease in the number of robbery, burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft complaints filed with the South Kingstown Police Department. The records did reflect a slight increase in assaults reported to the department.

The chart below depicts the number and types of offenses classified under the UCR that were reported to the police department since 2009.

The number of adult arrests recorded through UCR figures in 2014 totaled five hundred and forty nine (549). This figure represents an increase from five hundred and thirty one (531) arrests that were reported in 2013. Adult arrests increased in the reporting category of forcible rape, larceny, simple assault, embezzlement, prostitution and commercialized vice, offenses against family and children, and disorderly conduct. Adult arrests also increased for all traffic related offenses that constitute an arrest and for liquor law violations. There was a decrease in the number of arrests for the categories of aggravated assault, burglary, forgery and counterfeiting, fraud, stolen property, weapon possession, drug possession and distribution, and driving under the influence.

The number of DUI arrests decreased from one hundred and two (102) in 2013 to ninety five (95) in 2014.

The total number of juvenile arrests recorded in 2014 was sixty three (63). This is a significant increase from the reported forty seven (47) juvenile arrests recorded in 2013. Increases in juvenile arrests were recorded in the categories of burglary, simple assault, arson, possessing and receiving stolen property, vandalism, liquor law violations, disorderly conduct, and the sale and manufacturing of narcotics.

The arrests noted in the UCR are for reporting purposes and do not reflect all of the arrests made by the South Kingstown Police Department. The total number of arrests reported in 2014 totaled eight hundred and seventy three (873). This was a decrease from the reported total of nine hundred and fifty (950) reported in 2013. Some of the arrestable offenses are considered “quality of life” complaints such as public consumption of alcohol, improper conduct, and a variety of town ordinance violations. Although “quality of life” offenses are not reported in the UCR they remain an important component of policing as all unlawful conduct is disruptive to the citizens of South Kingstown. The South Kingstown Police Department strives towards suppressing all illegal and disruptive behavior to ensure the security of all South Kingstown residents.

Patrol, Detective, and Civilian personnel record and thoroughly investigate all complaints brought to the police department’s attention. Every effort is made to identify and hold accountable those persons who violate the law to fulfill the South Kingstown Police Department’s Mission Philosophy of: “total community service”.

HOMICIDE

The South Kingstown Police Department reported no incidents of criminal homicide for 2014.

RAPE/SEXUAL ASSAULT

The total number of offenses classified as “rape” reported to the department in 2014 six (6). Two (2) of the cases were unfounded, one (1) was closed at the victim’s request, one (1) was closed by arrest and two (2) remain open. The department refers all victims of sexual assault to the Sexual Assault and Trauma Resource Center. All allegations of sexual assault are thoroughly investigated and reviewed by the South Kingstown Police Prosecution Division and the Rhode Island Department of Attorney General. Due to the sensitive nature of these offenses no cases will be cited with details nor will information pertaining to the investigation be shared for purposes of this report.

ROBBERY

There was one (1) reported offense in the 2014 UCR that was categorized as robbery. This was a decrease from the reported number of two (2) robberies that were reported in 2013. The sole robbery case reported in 2014 was closed by arrest. In June, South Kingstown Police responded to the One Energy gas station located on Tower Hill Road in response to an armed robbery. The assailant was armed with a screwdriver and accosted the clerk stealing \$850.00 cash. Through investigation, a vehicle suspected to be connected to the robbery was located by the patrol division. This information was forwarded to detectives who were able to conduct a series of

interviews that led to the identification of a potential suspect. The suspect was arrested and provided a full confession to detectives regarding the robbery. The suspect plead guilty in Superior Court and is currently serving a four (4) year prison term for his involvement in this crime.

ASSAULT

The total number of assaults reported to the department in 2014 was one hundred and fifty three (153). This was an increase from the one hundred and forty one (141) reported in 2013. One hundred and forty (140) assaults reported to the department were classified as simple assaults resulting in misdemeanor offenses. Thirteen (13) of the assaults were classified as felony assaults. Seven (7) of the assaults were by strong arm and six (6) were by other dangerous weapons. It must be noted that one hundred and eight (108) of these incidents were cleared by UCR standards.

BURGLARY/BREAKING & ENTERING

There were sixty nine (69) breaking and entering and burglary complaints reported in 2014. This is a slight decrease from the seventy seven (77) breaking and entering and burglary complaints reported in 2013. It must be noted that of the sixty nine (69) complaints, twenty (20) of these complaints were deemed cleared by UCR standards. This data indicates the South Kingstown Police had a 28.9 % clearance rate for breaking and entering and burglary complaints in 2014. According to F.B.I. statistics, the national average for the clearance rate of breaking and entering and burglary complaints is 12.4%. The quantitative data concludes the South Kingstown Police had an approximate 65% higher clearance rate than the national average for breaking and entering and burglary complaints reported in 2014.

In April, the police department investigated breaking and entering complaints into the Campus Cinema and the Pump House. Detectives received information from a confidential source that identified a suspect in the breaking and entering investigations. Acting on this information, detectives were able to gather evidence that led to the arrest and conviction of two (2) individuals for these crimes. This investigation also led to the arrest and conviction of an additional individual for the distribution of narcotics. All three individuals are incarcerated at the Adult Corrections Institute in Cranston, RI as a result of these crimes.

During the months of April and May, five (5) commercial burglaries were reported to the police department from various town businesses. An assortment of money was stolen from cash registers and all of the businesses were vandalized as a result of the crimes. In June, the primary suspect in the South Kingstown crimes was arrested by Providence Police for committing similar crimes. South Kingstown and Narragansett Detectives interviewed the suspect at the Providence Police Department and obtained a confession for all five (5) burglaries that were committed in South Kingstown in addition to commercial burglaries that were committed in Narragansett. The suspect was charged and convicted for commercial burglaries that were committed throughout the state. The suspect is currently incarcerated for these crimes.

In June, a resident on Woodruff Avenue reported her house had been broken into and valuables had been stolen. A suspect was developed by patrol officers and the case was turned over to detectives for further investigation. In July, detectives gathered further information which led detectives to picking up the suspect for interrogation. The suspect confessed to breaking into the

residence on Woodruff Avenue and to breaking into two (2) town businesses during the months of January and July. The charges are currently pending in Superior Court.

LARCENY

The number of reported larceny complaints (not including theft of motor vehicles) in 2014 was two hundred and one (201). This number decreased slightly from the reported two hundred and twelve (212) reported in 2013. The UCR showed the total monetary value of property stolen in 2014 was \$257,129.00. Of this amount, \$45,062.00 in property was reported as recovered. The reported value of property stolen is not always accurate because often the values of the stolen property are only estimates provided by the complainants.

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

There were nine (9) motor vehicle thefts reported to the department in 2014. The number of reported motor vehicle thefts in 2014 remained consistent with the previous year as there were ten (10) reported motor vehicle thefts in 2013. Out of the nine (9) motor vehicle thefts reported in 2014, eight (8) of the offenses were cleared and one (1) offense was unfounded. Six (6) of the reported nine (9) stolen motor vehicles were recovered.

DRUGS/NARCOTICS

The combined number of adult and juvenile arrests in relation to drug offenses for 2014 was forty (40). This was a significant decrease from the reported total of fifty (50) drug related arrests in 2013. Again, it is strongly believed the sharp decrease in drug arrests recorded by the South Kingstown Police in 2013 and 2014 is directly correlated to the legislation enacted in 2012 to decriminalize small amounts of marijuana. The majority of the arrests were for possession of narcotics and eleven (11) of the total arrests were for delivery of narcotics. Several successful state and federal narcotic investigations were conducted during 2014.

The state and federal narcotic investigations resulted in the combined seizure of \$857,287.00 in cash and assets as well as the seizure of four (4) motor vehicles. \$55,761.68 of these funds has been earmarked for the South Kingstown Police Department under asset forfeiture sharing proceedings. These assets were lawfully seized in accordance with Federal and State law.

Several successful narcotic investigations were conducted in 2014. In November, members of the detective division initiated an investigation into the sale of narcotics out of a residence on Branch Street. The police department had been in receipt of several complaints by area residents complaining of high traffic in and out of a particular residence that was indicative of drug sales. Through investigation the detective division was able to acquire probable cause to obtain a warrant to search the suspected residence for narcotics. The search resulted in the seizure of marijuana, cocaine, illicit pharmaceutical drugs, and \$7,241.00 in cash. A juvenile male was charged with several felony drug offenses and remanded to RI Training School. The juvenile has been placed in a residential facility and placed on probation.

In November, the patrol division responded to a residence on Plains Road for a burglar alarm. During the on-scene investigation, patrol officers located what appeared to be illegal narcotics contained within the residence. Detectives and patrol officers executed an authorized search of

the residence and located a large amount of marijuana, marijuana paraphernalia, and cash. One individual has been charged with felony marijuana possession and the case is pending in Superior Court.

ARSON/FIRE INVESTIGATIONS

There were five (5) reported arson offenses in 2014. Two (2) of the offenses were closed by arrest and the remaining three (3) offenses remain open and on file in the detective division. In March, a small fire was ignited on Elm Road causing damage to an outdoor fence and personal property. The ensuing investigation revealed that four (4) juveniles were playing with a lighter and started the fire. The four (4) juveniles were charged with arson as a result of this investigation and referred to the Family Court system to face sanctions.

In April, a complaint was received there was a brush fire behind the Curtis Corner Middle School. Police and fire personnel responded and extinguished the fire. The investigation revealed that two (2) juveniles had started the fire by discharging a flare gun. The juveniles were charged with arson and referred to the Family Court system for sanctions.

JUVENILE DIVISION

The South Kingstown Police Department takes a pro-active stance on all aspects of Juvenile Justice. It involves the handling of criminal investigations as well as public relations and juvenile safety initiatives throughout the town. One of the main goals of the Juvenile Division is understanding and implementing rehabilitative measures for our community's juvenile population. Working with families, schools, South Kingstown Partnership for Prevention, South County Community Action and the Family Court is a key component of ensuring the youth in this community are being provided the help and guidance they need to grow into adulthood.

During the 2014 calendar year, Detective Jennifer Natale was the department Juvenile Officer. Detective Jennifer Natale has made a positive impact on the lives of the many juveniles she has dealt with over the year and her commitment to all of the community is appreciated and recognized.

The Juvenile Division prides itself in having a positive relationship with the staff and student bodies of the South Kingstown High School, Curtis Corner Middle School, Broad Rock Middle School as well as the four elementary schools within our community. The close relationship to all of the schools allows the Juvenile Division to gather necessary information needed to investigate criminal matters within the town.

Officer Jerome Gillen was the School Resource Officer for the 2014 calendar year. SRO Gillen maintains a positive presence within the South Kingstown High School. SRO Gillen not only serves as a law enforcement presence within the school but also fills the role of mentor and teacher providing the students with a safe environment for learning. SRO Gillen and Detective Natale continue to be involved with the South Kingstown Crisis Response Committee along with several members of the police department. This committee consists of principals, vice principals, teachers, police/fire officials and building supervisors from various schools and departments in the Town of South Kingstown. Discussions continue to focus on school safety, lock-downs, evacuations and both school and police response during emergency situations. SRO Gillen and Detective Natale have worked closely throughout the school year taking a pro-active role with students, mediating potential criminal activity and investigating incidents in and out of the school.

Officer Michael Chappell participated in numerous lectures at the South Kingstown High School, middle schools and elementary schools. Officer Chappell conducted the following programs/lectures:

- The dangers of drinking and driving presented to the 11th grade at the South Kingstown High School.
- Health Awareness Day at West Kingston, Wakefield and Matunuck Elementary Schools.
- Safety First Program at Stepping Stone Pre-school.
- Driver's education and Home Alone Programs at the Neighborhood Guild.
- Worked with Boy Scout Troop 1 to help Boy Scouts obtain Merit Badges in Law Enforcement.
- Organized multiple car seat checkpoint events throughout the Town of South Kingstown.
- Achieved Instructor status as a car seat technician.

Juvenile arrests increased from 47 in 2013 to 63 in 2014. The actual number of juvenile arrests is slightly higher in the police department records as opposed to those juvenile arrests reported in

the Uniform Crime Report. This is due to the fact that the UCR only reports on certain categories of crime. Traffic offenses and other minor offenses are not considered for UCR reporting purposes. Juvenile arrests were for drug and alcohol violations (excluding under an ounce possession of marijuana), arson, assaults, burglary, larceny, malicious damage, possession of stolen property, shoplifting, disorderly conduct, violation of court orders, NCIC wanted persons, breaking and entering, and weapons violations. Wayward and disobedient petitions were omitted from the statistical reports as they had been previously classified as arrests.

The delinquent cases handled this past year included possession with intent schedule I, II, possession of schedule I, III, IV, larceny, burglary and breaking and entering. All of the youths arrested for criminal and/or status offenses were referred to the Family Court, Drug Court or the Youth Diversionary Program. Some juveniles involved in minor offenses received warnings.

TRAINING DIVISION

It is the policy of the South Kingstown Police Department to provide a professional standard of law enforcement service to the community. In filling that responsibility, it is essential that departmental personnel be properly trained. The training function with the department is vested in the department's Training Officer. It is the responsibility of the Training Officer to facilitate job related training to all sworn and civilian members of the department.

The training goals of the South Kingstown Police Department are:

- To provide job related training for all department personnel.
- To train employees to be better prepared to act decisively and correctly in a broad spectrum of situations.
- To enhance employee productivity, effectiveness and knowledge through professional development and a structured training curriculum.
- To foster cooperation and unity of purpose among department members through common training.
- To provide training for specialization, promotional opportunity and general safety of the employee and those with whom they come in contact.

The department purchased 11 conductive electrical weapons (TASER's) to be utilized on patrol, special details and other operations. Officers will be trained in the use of these weapons in 2015. These should prove an effective tool in subduing a person without the use of deadly physical force.

The Training Division has also been tasked with spearheading the department's efforts to attain accreditation through the Rhode Island Police Accreditation Commission. This process is a means to conduct an on-going internal review and assessment of policies and procedures as well as an in-depth look at the department's organization, management and operations. The goal is for the department to continue to maintain the highest standards of professionalism. The Division is striving to complete the accreditation process within the next year.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

This department continually strives to keep all computer technology up to date. With its many network servers, workstations, printers, mobile units, digital cameras, routers, scanners and many other types of equipment, it can be a daunting task to have them all connected properly and constantly available.

Department staff works collaboratively with the Town Administration on the new computerized financial management system for budgeting, purchasing, and payroll functions for the Public Safety Division.

In 2014, three workstations, one printer and three notebooks were replaced due to obsolescence. In addition the report writing printer was replaced by a multifunction copier/printer/scanner which is expected to save hundreds of dollars over its lifetime. The animal shelter's workstation and printer were also replaced due to age and the additional need to connect it to the Town's MUNIS accounting system.

Previously the patrol division shared roughly a half dozen digital cameras for use at crime and accident scenes. This created many issues with tracking and keeping all the cameras available, often the need to send a camera out to a location would create logistical issues. In 2014, our department purchased forty-two (42) new digital cameras and issued them to each officer as part of their personal gear.

The department also replaced two (2) cellular modems and one (1) mobile printer to replace older units.

In 2015, the main server and network related equipment will be replaced due to age. In addition, five (5) workstations, eleven (11) printers, eleven (11) mobile notebooks, as well as some other miscellaneous computer components may need to be replaced. As always, we attempt to keep all equipment in service for as long as it is economically possible. Because the main server will be replaced utilizing virtual server technology and is expected to be equipped with a newer Microsoft Server 2012 operating system, the network administrator is expected to receive extensive training in both topics prior to the equipment implementation.

As part of this department's planned network upgrade, the entire Public Safety Building's internal CAT5 computer wiring is also expected to be replaced with more current CAT6 wiring.

The current radio and telephone audio recording system which was purchased in February 2010 is also expected to be upgraded due to age and compatibility in the spring of 2015.

DIVE TEAM

In 2013 the South Kingstown Police Department entered into an agreement to join the Union Fire District Dive Team. This merger allowed the dive team to expand the scope of their abilities from search and recovery to include law enforcement activities such as evidence collection. Currently there are six officers assigned to the dive team which is led by Lieutenant James J. Krajewski.

The mission of the team is to maintain an emergency response unit capable of responding on short notice at any time, to any place within the Town of South Kingstown, including, but not limited to creeks, rivers, ponds, lakes, and Block Island Sound or to assist in search and recovery operations.

The team is the primary water response unit in South Kingstown for:

1. Location and/or recovery of drowning victims.
2. Recovery of various types of property and vehicles involved in accidental mishap or loss (i.e. automobiles, motorcycles, boats, airplanes, etc.).
3. Search and recovery of evidence and/or property.

In 2014 the team conducted approximately thirty-five (35) hours of training on various topics including; swimming proficiency, open-water diving, boat operations, advanced equipment operation, various search pattern techniques on land and in the water, low visibility operations, and ship wreck operations. The team also served as the safety team for the Crab Man Triathlon in Matunuck.

The team is also the only remaining dive team in operation for the South County area and we are currently reaching out to surrounding communities to establish mutual aid agreements to cover the region.

RECORDS ANALYSIS 2014

ROBBERY

Robbery is a type of theft that is committed in the presence of the victim. The victim, who usually is the owner or person having custody of the property, is directly confronted by the perpetrator and is threatened with force or is put in fear that force will be used. Robbery involves a theft or larceny but is aggravated by the element of force or threat of force.

In 2014 there was one (1) offense of robbery reported. Compared to the prior year, this is one (1) less offense than reported in 2013, or a decrease of 50%. The total monetary value of items taken in the one (1) robbery was \$850. This amount is \$600 more than the value of goods taken in the two (2) robberies in 2013.

BREAKING AND ENTERING

Breaking and Entering is the unlawful entry or attempted forcible entry of any structure to commit a felony or larceny. Breaking and Entering is categorized into three sub classifications:

- A. Forcible Entry
- B. Unlawful Entry- where no force is used.
- C. Attempted Forcible Entry

In 2014 there were sixty-eight (68) offenses of breaking and entering reported. Compared to 2013, there were nine (9) less reported offenses. The total monetary value of items taken in the sixty-eight (68) breaks in 2014 was \$72,265. This amount is \$89,607 less than the amount of goods taken in the seventy-seven (77) breaks in 2013. The average monetary value of the goods taken in 2014 is \$1,063 per break. This is \$1,040 less per break than the 2013 average.

LARCENY - THEFT

Larceny-Theft is the unlawful stealing, taking or carrying away of property from the possession of another with intent to convert or deprive the owner thereof. It includes crimes such as Shoplifting, Bicycle theft, Larceny from buildings and from coin operated machines, etc. For the purpose of this report, this crime category does not include Robbery, Breaking and Entering, Embezzlements, Unlawful Conversions, and Larceny by Fraud or Bad Check Cases. Motor Vehicle Theft is also excluded from this category as it is a separate crime index offense and is shown separately.

In 2014 there were two hundred-one (201) offenses of larceny-theft reported. This figure reflects a decrease of eight (8) offenses when compared with the 2013 figure. The total monetary value of items taken in these offenses during 2014 was \$130,325. This averages \$648 per offense, which is a decrease of \$126 per offense when compared to the 2013 figures.

MOTOR VEHICLE - THEFT

For the purpose of this report, *Motor Vehicle Theft* is defined as the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. This definition excludes the taking of a motor vehicle for temporary use by those persons having lawful access to the vehicle (i.e. chauffeur, employee, etc.).

In 2014 there were eight (8) offenses of motor vehicle theft, two (2) less than the amount in 2013. In 2014, eight (8) vehicles at a total value of \$53,689 were stolen. During this period, six (6) vehicles were recovered.

VALUE OF PROPERTY STOLEN AND RECOVERED

Listed below is the value of properties stolen and recovered since 2005. The South Kingstown Police Department makes every effort to locate and recover stolen property and see that it is returned to its rightful owner. While the case, applying a ten year average to the monetary value of the property stolen/recovered, the statistics reflect an average of 16.77% of the value of all stolen property is recovered.

To help prevent South Kingstown's citizens from becoming victims of crime and suffering property losses, the police department provides education in crime prevention techniques. Effective crime prevention involves a joint effort from police, business owners and the community. Together, we can work toward keeping the town's neighborhoods safe and ensuring a high quality of life.

Relationship Of Victim To Offender By Victim Age




