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Program Overview

How It Works:

- Stop in at any South Kingstown Public Library branch to sign up and get a tracking sheet.
- Every time you or someone else reads a book to your child, color a spot on the sheet.
- When you complete the sheet, turn it in at the library.

Remember, if you read the same book over and over again, it counts each time! Also, stories read to your child at school, storytime...or anywhere all count!

Reading Milestones

Every 50 books you read, you get a sticker!

At 250, 500, 750 books, get a small surprise!

At 1,000 books, get a certificate and a free book!

Early Literacy Activity

One of the skills children need to develop is called narrative skills. This means a child being able to tell stories and describe things. Babies can't tell stories yet, but you can encourage their efforts to talk. Listen patiently as your baby tries to talk and encourage your baby's chatter and responses. With older children, create stories together!
