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Program Overview

How It Works:

- Stop in at any South Kingstown Public Library branch to sign up and get a tracking sheet.
- Every time you or someone else reads a book to your child, color a spot on the sheet.
- When you complete the sheet, turn it in at the library.

Remember, if you read the same book over and over again, it counts each time! Also, stories read to your child at school, storytime...or anywhere all count!

Reading Milestones

Every 50 books you read, you get a sticker!
At 250, 500, 750 books, get a small surprise!
At 1,000 books, get a certificate and a free book!

Early Literacy Tip

Writing and reading go together!

Scribbling and drawing are forms of writing—they may not be words, but lines and the pictures your child draws mean something to them. Plus, it helps develop hand eye coordination and motor control they need to hold a pencil. Ask them to tell you about what they draw. You can also draw with them and tell stories about YOUR drawings. You child won't care if your picture is perfect.
