





13th Street: Battle of the Bad-Breath Bats by David Bowles


Our Friend Hedgehog: The Story of Us by Lauren Castillo


Jasper & Scruff: The Cool Cat Club by Nicola Colton


Stella Endicott and the Anything-Is-Possible Poem by Kate DiCamillo


Fox & Rabbit by Beth Ferry




Unicorn Diaries: Bo's Magical New Friend by Rebecca Elliott


Mindy Kim and the Yummy Seaweed Business by Lyla Lee


Baloney and Friends by Greg Pizzoli


Charlie & Mouse Outdoors by Laurel Snyder
