### AMENDED EXECUTIVE ORDER ISSUED WITH NOTICE TO SEASONAL RESIDENTS & VISITORS QUARANTINE FOR 14 DAYS IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19

**MARCH 27, 2020:** The Town of South Kingstown is monitoring the ongoing COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic, is following State and Federal guidance to help promote the health and safety of our community, and is implementing additional precautionary measures to reduce opportunities for COVID-19 transmission in South Kingstown. In response to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the State of Emergency declared by the Governor March 9<sup>th</sup>, 2020, the Declaration of Emergency by the Town Council March 15<sup>th</sup>, 2020, the Town Manager has issued Executive Orders implementing additional directives. **Please be advised the Town Manager has amended the Executive Order 2020-03 issued March 25<sup>th</sup>, 2020** in order to provide additional information and to provide further directives. The full amended Executive Order and Notice to Seasonal Residents & Visitors is attached to this Press Release for ease in reference.

- **Travel to the Town of South Kingstown is discouraged for non-residents or seasonal residents.**
- **Non-residents and seasonal residents must self-quarantine for 14 days upon arrival to South Kingstown.**
- **Owners and operators of short-term lodging must inform guests of the quarantine requirement, and arrange for delivery service for food and other essentials.**
- **Owners and operators of short-term lodging that do not have on-site property management must cease taking new reservations for occupancy dates that fall within the emergency ordinance period.**
- **Businesses which remain open in South Kingstown must post a copy of the attached Notice and Executive Order so that it is visible to all people entering the business.**
- **The South Kingstown Police Department shall have the authority to enforce the Executive Order, and any violation punishable by a \$500 fine per day the violation continues.**

**Guidance for Members of the Public:** During this pandemic, all residents are strongly advised to minimize their risk through the use of social distancing. The Town and the Governor have advised residents to please stay home, except for running essential errands such as going to the grocery store or pharmacy. Please be advised that even when gathering in small numbers, social distancing guidance is to maintain a distance of at least 6 feet from other people. Residents are strongly advised to follow proper handwashing techniques, and proper cough and sneeze techniques; to remain home if you are sick (with any symptoms); and to self-quarantine for 14 days and contact RIDOH if you have traveled anywhere internationally in the last 14 days. Residents should be aware of potential COVID-19 symptoms including fever, cough, and shortness of breath. Residents are advised to contact their healthcare provider if they believe they may have COVID-19, and per RIDOH guidance, please do not go directly to a healthcare facility without first calling, unless you are experiencing a medical emergency. Residents are strongly advised to stay up to date on the Federal, State, and local response to, and guidance on, the evolving COVID-19 situation. Because of the evolving nature of this ongoing community health situation, the Town may implement additional mitigation measures with short notice, and the information provided here is subject to change. ### EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DIRECTOR EXECUTIVE ORDER 2020-03 (AMENDED)

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of South Kingstown declared a state of emergency through an emergency ordinance enacted on March 15, 2020 to deal with the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council delegated emergency authority to the Town Manager to take measures he deems necessary in order to protect public health and safety in response to the pandemic; and

WHEREAS, social distancing is the most effective and important tool available to combat the spread of the pandemic;


NOW THEREFORE, the following emergency measures are hereby enacted:

1. Travel to South Kingstown is discouraged for any non-resident or seasonal residents. Full-time residents are encouraged to restrict travel for essential purposes only, such as medical care, care of a family member, or obtaining food and other necessary provisions. For the purposes of this order, full-time students at the University of Rhode Island that are residing in Town, whether off campus or on campus, are considered full-time residents.
2. Any non-resident or seasonal resident arriving to South Kingstown must immediately Self-Quarantine (as that term is hereinafter defined) for two weeks and follow any Center for Disease Control (CDC) and Rhode Island Department of Health (RIDOH) guidelines pertaining to the pandemic. This provision shall not apply to a nonresident whose employment requires entry into Town, so long as the activities conducted in Town are limited to those necessary for employment.
3. Any non-resident property owner who travels to South Kingstown to temporarily reside on or in their property must remain at that property for the duration of their stay or 14 days, whichever is shorter.
4. The term "Self-Quarantine" means to remain at your residence except for medical care or emergencies. Self-Quarantine includes having food and other necessities delivered to the residence rather than leaving the residence to obtain such food/necessities. Persons under Self-Quarantine must monitor for symptoms such as fever, cough and shortness of breath.

5. All Short-Term Lodging owners and operators shall inform their guests when making reservations and upon arrival that the guests' travel and movement within South Kingstown is restricted due to the ongoing pandemic, and that all guests must remain on the Short-Term Lodging property for the duration of their stay. All owners and operators of Short-Term Lodging facilities must arrange delivery service for their guests during the effective period, so that guests are not required to leave the Short-Term Lodging for food or other essentials. For purposes of this emergency ordinance, "Short-Term Lodging" is lodging of thirty (30) days or fewer, including, but not limited to, lodging in hotels, inns, and motels.
6. All Short-Term Lodging owners and operators that do not have an on-site property manager shall cease taking new reservations for occupancy dates which fall within the effective period of the emergency ordinance, unless the lodging is provided to public safety professionals and/or medical professionals who are locating in Town for the purpose of responding to the COVID-19 pandemic. This provision specifically includes, but is not limited to, owners and operations taking reservations through online rental platforms such as Air BnB.
7. All essential businesses remaining open in the Town of South Kingstown must post a copy of this order in a prominent place, so that it is visible to all people entering the business.
8. Any violation of any provision of this executive order is punishable by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500), with every day a violation continues considered a separate violation. The South Kingstown Police Department shall have the authority to enforce this executive order.
9. To the extent that any provision in this order is inconsistent with any executive order issued by the Governor of Rhode Island for dealing with COVID-19, the executive order of the Governor shall supersede this order and govern in its stead.
10. This executive order shall remain in effect until April 15, 2020 unless terminated prior to that date by a subsequent order. This executive order may be further extended if necessary by a subsequent executive order.

# NOTICE TO SEASONAL RESIDENTS AND VISITORS TO SOUTH KINGSTOWN

---

**MARCH 25, 2020:** With the dramatic increase in COVID-19 cases in the New York City metropolitan area, in recent days Rhode Island shoreline communities have seen an unseasonably high number of visitors. Many New York and Connecticut residents own summer homes in Southern Rhode Island and these summer residents are an important part of our economy and contribute significance to the character of our community.

We implore those coming in from the New York metropolitan areas to engage in safe social distancing practices. While South Kingstown may seem like a safe refuge from the outbreak in the City, we still need to remember that we are only as safe as the practices we use to limit the spread of the virus.

In order to reduce the risk of inadvertent community spread, the South Kingstown Police Department will enforce a local order directing that **ALL VISITORS arriving in South Kingstown must quarantine themselves for 14 days after their arrival in town**. Violation of the quarantine requirement will subject each violator to a \$500 fine for each violation. Please refer to Executive Order 2020-03, as amended March 27<sup>th</sup>, 2020 for additional detail.
